

Our Spring Reunion will be in Honor of Illustrious Hassel "Pete" Johnston, 33°, IGH



Born on April 25, 1942, in Jeffrey, West Virginia, Hassel "Pete" Johnston passed away on February 20, 2023, in Newport News, Virginia. He was the son of the late Jason and Tennessee Johnston. Pete graduated from Scott High School in Madison, West Virginia, in 1960, where he excelled as a three-sport letterman in football, basketball, and baseball. His upbringing in a house built by his father, a career coal miner, instilled a strong work ethic and a caring soul. In 1962, Pete left home and moved to Virginia for more opportunities for himself and his family. He embarked on a remarkable 42-year career at Newport News Shipbuilding, participating in sea trials for 11 aircraft carriers built by Newport News, including CVN65 (Enterprise) through CVN75 (Harry Truman). His work also took him internationally on numerous commercial vessels. Pete retired in 2004 Marine Chemist and a Master Shipbuilder. Despite working fulltime, often on night shifts, he built, owned, and operated a laundromat and two hardware stores. A devoted member of

Trinity Lutheran Church in Newport News. He was also a Smithfield Union Lodge No. 18 member and a 33° Mason with the Valley of Newport News Scottish Rite, where he volunteered much of his time. Known for his generosity and love of family, he attended his children's and grandchildren's ball games, swim meets, horse shows, go-cart races, and even coached youth football. Pete enjoyed following NASCAR and college sports. In his final years, he cared for his wife, Joan, and took immense pride in keeping his vows through sickness and health.

We often hear that the Scottish Rite is the "College of Freemasonry." A place to gain more light in masonry and expand our understanding of our history and what it means to be a Freemason. Fortunately, this Valley has educational programs like the <u>Masonic Book Club</u>, led by Rt. Wor. & Bro. Gerald Frey, 32°, KCCH, and a <u>Masonic Leadership</u> program, coordinated by Wor. & Bro. Billy Spencer, 32°. In addition, the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction (scottishrite.org) "<u>Master Craftsman Online College and Leadership Academy</u>" provides learning opportunities to both Master Masons and Scottish Rite members:

"<u>The Master's Steps</u>" is available to all Master Masons. You are not required to be a member of the Scottish Rite. In this mini-course, Master Masons learn about Masonic History and Symbolism. The course is designed not only for newly raised Master Masons but also for Masons with decades of experience.

Also available to all Master Masons is the "<u>Tyler's Place Podcast</u>," which has 136 podcasts about various Masonic topics. They provide easy listening to discussions about subjects of interest to all Masons. The "<u>Scottish Rite Journal Podcast</u>" includes 144 readings of featured articles from the "<u>Scottish Rite Journal</u>." If you haven't had a chance to read these articles or are a Master Mason and find something of interest, sit back in your favorite chair and enjoy some of the most informative articles in the Journal. The website also links to "Featured Content" articles and "Featured News" in the Southern Jurisdiction.

For the Scottish Rite Mason, the website offers online Master Craftsman courses emphasizing Masonic and Scottish Rite history, ritual, and philosophy. Courses include "Philosophy," "Ritual and Philosophy," "Wisdom and Reflection," and "Why 33". Also offered is "Ordo Ab Chao" (Order from Chaos), which addresses the Manifesto of 1802. This document presents a Romantic and Authentic history of high degrees of Masonry and announces the Supreme Council to the Masonic world.

Finally, Albert Pike's "<u>Morals & Dogma</u>" is an excellent source of Masonic and Scottish Rite education, but if, like me, you are not ready for Brother Pike's writings, check out the Scottish Rite Southern Jurisdiction website.

- Have not previously received this award.

Sign of the Good Shepherd

Predicated upon its basic foundation of belief in a personal God, the Scottish Rite gives primary importance to its Degrees and its meetings to prayer. While there is an established position and sign to be used by all Scottish Rite Masons during prayer, this position and sign are sometimes not uniformly practiced. Scottish Rite Masons (except when engaged in ritual at the altar) stand during prayer, with caps remaining upon the head as part of ta uniform. What is also required is giving the accompanying "Sign of the Good Shepherd". This is done by folding the arms, left over the right, with the outstretched fingers touching the shoulders. This position is comfortable and easily remembered if it is realized that the sign represents the Good Shepherd carrying a lamb around his neck and holding its feet by his crossed hands. During the prayer, in this position, the head is slightly bowed.
