

Boy! Where has the time gone? Are the years getting shorter? This office saw a lot of activity in 2022 and we are looking forward to a busy year in 2023. One of the most important subjects for most secretaries – is dues!! Please look at your membership cards and if it does not say “2023”, or you don’t remember if you have paid your 2023 dues, then you may be in arrears for your dues. It is with your dues that we pay our bills, keep the Newport News Scottish Rite facilities operating, and the grounds, a place of pride for the neighborhood. Thanks to the Herculean efforts of Ill. Dave Burkus, 33°, IGH, we have more than 80% of the members have paid their 2023 dues. Thank you everyone!

As a note, the *Statutes of the Supreme Council* state: “Anyone who is in arrears for two (2) years must be suspended for Non-Payment of dues”. For every year that a person is on our membership list, Newport News is assessed \$31.00, for the Supreme Council Per Capita. Last year’s per capita fee was ten thousand dollars. So, you can see the burden that is placed on the Newport News Scottish Rite if members don’t pay their dues on time.

Please look at your membership card and call the Scottish Rite office if you have any questions and let’s get them up to date. You can use your credit card to pay your dues in the member area of the Supreme Council web site (<https://scottishrite.org/>) or you can call the office and to discuss other options. Our office hours are Monday through Thursday: 9 AM to Noon.

Another item that plagues Secretaries is keeping up with members’ contact information. As we have over 300 members, it can be a daunting task to keep the rolls accurate. If any of your “profile” information changes, ie, things like street or email address, phone number, job status, etc, either change it on the Supreme Council’s member page or call the office and we will update it for you.




