

I have the privilege to serve this year as the District Deputy Grand Master for Masonic District 14. This may not seem to be a topic for the Valley newsletter, except for the fact the Blue Lodges and our appendant bodies are all in the same boat when it comes to membership. Most Worshipful Don Strehle, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Virginia, has set a goal of bringing in 1200 new Virginia Masons and has requested all Masonic Districts in Virginia hold a One-Day Conferral of the Masonic Degrees on April 29.

As a Masonic appendant body, we rely on our Blue Lodges for a source of membership. Brethren, this is an opportunity for all appendant bodies to get new members. If you know a man of good character who demonstrates the same high moral standards we strive to achieve, please take this opportunity to talk to them about Masonry. Invite them to your Lodge dinners, breakfasts, or social events. Nothing has changed, the candidate must ask to be a Mason, and his petition requires the signature of two Master Masons, a background check, and an unanimous vote of the Lodge. The upside is you now have a Brother you may never have had the opportunity to work with, to share your Masonic experiences, and to make him an asset to the Blue Lodge and potentially the appendant bodies. Remember we are all in the same boat, which requires good men to carry on our Masonic traditions, and a rising tide lifts all boats.

On the home front, I want to thank everyone who participated in our Haunted House and Fall Sausage Sale. The Haunted House (or "Walk of Terror") received recognition from the city of Newport News as a top tourist attraction for the Fall season. It took approximately 12 Brethren 10 hours to prepare, grind, package, and clean up. I want to thank everyone for their hard work preparing and selling the sausage. Although it was a long day it was filled with fellowship and fun.

The Rite Care Center at Old Dominion University works with children that have language, hearing, and/or speech impediments. The Valley of Newport News Scottish Rite Foundation supports these efforts through your generous contributions and participation in this golf tournament and assists with tuition for graduate-level students working in this field.

On the morning of the tournament, you will be able to meet some of the students and a professor or two who work with these children. They participate by helping with registration and sales of raffle tickets and mulligan tickets.

The tournament will be a "Captain's Choice" held at Riverfront Golf Club, 5200 River Club Drive, Suffolk, Virginia, with registration beginning at 8:00 a.m. followed by "tee" time at 9:00 a.m. Included in the tournament will be a "goodie bag" for each golfer, raffle prizes, and a delicious lunch of fried chicken, barbecue, baked beans, slaw, a cookie, and a drink.
