Greetings Brethren,

Brethren, as we move into the second quarter of the year, I am saddened to report the passing of our Valley Treasurer, Ill. Gerald Edward Burks, 33° IGH. Brother Burks served the Valley with distinction for many years and will be missed by all who knew him. Brother Richard Rawls, 32° KCCH, Assistant Treasurer, has been appointed by Ill. James Dean Cole, 33° SGIG in Virginia, to fill the position of Treasurer for the Valley of Newport News. Please join me in giving Brother Rawls our support and vote of confidence as he undertakes this most important and responsible position.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank our Orient Conference President, Brother Page Neale, 32° KCCH, for an excellent Conference Workshop held in the Scottish Rite Masonic Center, Richmond Virginia on March 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Valley of Newport News had 18 brethren in attendance; the program, food and fellowship were excellent and enjoyed by all.

As we move forward into the second quarter of the year, I would be remiss if I did not update you on the progress your Valley is making. Our handicap equipment Center is running at maximum capacity. Request for Handicap equipment is growing daily and often from long distances. There is no doubt that our services are appreciated and beneficial to the public. The Center is now under the umbrella of our Foundation and managed by Brother George Winslow, 32°. Unfortunately, Brother George has only one individual to assist him with equipment repairs, receiving and issuing equipment, etc. His assistant is a handicapped non-Mason who volunteered to assist in this public service activity. Brethren if you have a couple of hours a day, one to four days a week to contribute in support of the Center, we would be eternally grateful.

Our Facility Lighting Project is approximately 75% complete. Thanks to the dedicate efforts of Brother Leonard Mayo, 32° KCCH who has contributed his time and resources to making this effort possible. We have the parking lights to convert to LED lighting. This final phase will be contracted to an electrical company with the proper ground equipment to perform the task.

Our Facility Rental Program and other fund-raising activities under the direction of Brother Bruce Edwards, 32° KCCH, Assistant Personal Representative for the Valley, are doing exceptionally well. Rentals are increasing to a point where our operating Fund shortfall has been reduced significantly. Thanks to all who support our fund-raising activities.

In an effort to improve on our Reunion experiences, for both for the Candidates' as well as our members, we are modifying the time element for degree performance. Briefly, we are establishing a mid-week work night to confer the 4-14<sup>th</sup> Degrees, allowing the Candidates to participate in Lodge of Perfection activities while waiting on subsequent Degree scheduling. The 18th and 30<sup>th</sup> degrees to be performed by the Valley of Portsmouth in their Masonic Center as scheduled. The final Degree will be performed in the Valley of Newport News. The change will afford some flexibility for our Degree Teams and Candidates. We also intend to minimize the time frame between Reunions, rather than have a candidate wait six months between Reunions, we can and will schedule Degree conferrals as often as candidate availability dictates. Your support of this initiative is paramount for success. Our first work Night for our Reunion will be held on April 23, 2019.

In summary, our Valley is productive, harmony and fellowship are exceptional. I thank all for the team spirit and commitment to the betterment of our Fraternity.

### Comments from the President of the 2019 Scottish Rite Conference of Virginia; Brother Page S. Neale, Jr. 32° KCCH

#### Greetings Brethren:

The ninety-fifth annual meeting of the Scottish Rite Conference of Virginia will be held on Friday and Saturday, September 27 and 28 at the Holiday Inn, Newport News - Hampton (formerly the Omni Hotel), located at 980 Omni Boulevard, Newport News, Virginia 23606, telephone number (757) 223-2110. With exception of the Thursday afternoon golf outing at Kiln Creek Golf Club and the KCCH Investiture which will be held at the Valley of Newport News Scottish Rite/Masonic Center on Saturday afternoon, all other Conference Activities will be held at the hotel.

A room block has been reserved for the Conference. Be reminded that each Valley/Brother is responsible for making reservations with the hotel for their required rooms. You may call the Holiday Inn Newport News-Hampton at (757) 223-2110 to make your reservation. Please refer to the **group code -SRC**. The cost per room is \$114.00 plus city and state taxes and a \$1.00 fee which brings the total to \$130.86 per night. The room block will be held until the cutoff date of August 25, 2019, at which time any rooms not reserved will be released.

The format will be Captains choice best ball and the fee for a round of golf with electric cart is \$35.00 per player and you will pay at the Pro Shop on the day of the outing. For registration, however, please contact Ill. Adrian (Pete) Eure, Newport News Valley Secretary (757) 599-6617 to be placed on the list of participants so that the Golf Pro can prepare accordingly. Please make your reservation no later than August 25, 2019 if at all possible.

Our Knights of Saint Andrew will be available on your arrival at the hotel to assist you with your luggage, registration, and getting you settled into your room.

The Valley attendance and meal registration form can be obtained from Ill. Adrian (Pete) Eure 33°, and must be completed and returned to him at 65 Saunders Road, Newport News, Virginia 23601, electronically or by regular mail, no later than <u>August 25, 2019</u>. Please enclose a check (made payable to the Newport News Scottish Rite) with your completed form to cover the cost of meals. Cancellations and/or additions for banquets and the Ladies Luncheon will be accepted until September 6, 2019. No refunds can be made for meals after that date. The cost of the dinner meal (per person) for Friday's banquet is \$37.00 and for Saturday's banquet is \$47.00. The Ladies Luncheon is \$23.00 each. Please include on your meal registration form, a listing of any dietary restrictions for your members/guests.


