Brethren,

We received a report from the Sovereign Grand Inspector General in Virginia, Ill. James D. Cole, 33°, concerning members who are delinquent in dues. He said that throughout the entire Southern Jurisdiction, 8.9% of our members are in arrears with their dues. Unfortunately, in Virginia, some Valleys have as high as 14.6% of our members are in arrears. The Supreme Council is going to contact each member who is in arrears with their dues by e-mail and encourage them to pay their dues by the use of the Supreme Council's "on line dues payment". Here in the Valley of Newport News, we have many of our members who have not paid their dues for 1, 2, or more years. Our Membership Chairman, Brother Joseph Myers, 32°, KCCH, has sent letters to each of our delinquent Brothers and the response has been good. If you are arrears in your dues and have received a letter from Brother Myers and have not answered the letter, because you no longer are a member of a Masonic Lodge, please let us know. As you know, YOU MUST BE A MEMBER OF A MASONIC LODGE, to hold membership in the Scottish Rite. If you no longer belong to a Masonic Lodge, we can remove your name from our list of members as this will help us to keep our records up to date. You can call the Scottish Rite office or e-mail us with this information. But I encourage you to contact this office and we will help you to get your dues up to date! If you have paid your dues and have not received your 2017 dues card, please let me know. As you know, you need your dues card to attend the Stated Meetings. Sometimes we may miss pulling your card and mailing it to you, so if have not received your dues card, please let me know.


