I am pleased to report that our Scottish Rite Foundation is doing well. As you may know, our Foundation was set up to provide support for the Scottish Rite Speech and Language Center at Old Dominion University and to support our Medical Equipment Community Outreach Program. In the last few months, the community demand for medical equipment has increased significantly. Therefore, to meet the demand for equipment and our need for storage space we have undertaken a project to expand the Medical Center's footprint. We have been working with the City of Newport News to negotiate and complete the necessary drawings and building permit approvals. The expansion will consist of an additional 25X40 foot wing. We estimate completion by June of this year. I would be remiss if I didn't thank you my Brethren for supporting our Golf Tournament and Valley fundraisers that directly support our Foundation. In addition, all donations to the Foundation are tax exempt, greatly appreciated and recognized.

In closing, I remind each of you that our Masonic Center is a 28,000 sq. ft. facility with daily activities which require personnel to manage, perform maintenance, communicate with the public and support many other center activities. Ray Knittel, 33° PGM, the SGIG in Atlanta and Ill. Ross Laver, 33°, Secretary of the Valley of Atlanta, for their help presenting Brother Levenson his certificate and pin. He also talks about his love of Masonry and especially the - Shrine. He is certainly proud to be a Mason. - 11. VALLEY ORGANIZATIONS

As many of you may know the Scottish Rite building for the Valley of Richmond is for sale. The Norfolk Scottish Rite is moving from its Granby Street location in Norfolk to the Khedive Shrine Center in Chesapeake January 1, 2021. These Valleys' have been forced to make hard decisions due to a decline in membership and the rising cost of maintaining their aging buildings. These problems are not acute to Richmond or Norfolk. We face the same challenges in our Valley and many of our Blue Lodges.

The Newport News Valley building is faced with the expensive replacement of two air conditioning units, roof leaks, tile floor repairs, replacing corroded auditorium light fixtures, and the list goes on. More disappointing our Valley membership is now below 500.

On the good side, we are managing our building problems. Many thanks to Brothers Leonard Mayo, Randy Maney and John Gleason for volunteering to do many of the small building repairs that we would otherwise have to pay a contractor to fix. Our facility rentals have made a good start this year. Hopefully the coronavirus will not slow rentals down. We had a very successful Scottish Rite fundraiser with a concert by the Virginia Li'l Ole Opry. Thanks to everyone that supported the fundraiser, hopefully more fundraisers to come. Our Newport News Scottish Rite Foundations (501-3C) allows members and non-members to make tax deductible contributions to support our charities. Also, check out the best Scottish Rite website in the state (nnscottishrite.org). We are working hard to keep you informed and our Valley strong.

Brethren, our biggest challenge and where we are falling behind is membership. Not only new members but membership participation. The same strong beliefs that attracted you to Freemasonry are still here. The same Brotherhood, friendships, likeminded men and educational opportunities are still here.
