It was an extreme pleasure for your Valley Personal Representative, and me to recently visit Ill. Brother Mayer Sarfan, 33° IGH and his lovely wife Dorene at the Newport Nursing Home, just a short time prior to his passing away. We visited them on Tuesday, October 17<sup>th</sup> 2017.

Brother Sarfan was a lifelong resident of Newport News and worked at Newport News Shipbuilding while still attending high school. After graduating from high school he attended the University of Virginia, where he obtained both a BS degree as well as his law degree.

After graduating from the University of Virginia, he served in the United States Army, first as a clerk, but after his commanding officer saw him reading books on law, he had him transferred to the Criminal Investigating Division. After serving his Country in the Army, he returned to Newport News and was a founding partner of Sarfan and Nachman, Attorneys-at-Law and a land developer for more than fifty years.

Brother Mayer has spent his entire adult life as a generous supporter and contributor to many charities and organizations, particularly the Boy Scouts of America, his synagogue Rodef Shalom Temple, the United Jewish Community of the Virginia Peninsula, where he was instrumental in funding the Preschool building at the UJCVP as well. Brother Sarfan was also an avid supporter of numerous museums and charities, and was on the Foundation Board for Christopher Newport University.

Brother Mayer was an Eagle Scout, first president of Mercury 64 Kiwanis Club, a member of Bremond Masonic Lodge 241 AF&AM, and a 33<sup>rd</sup> Degree Scottish Rite Mason. He was the Legal Counsel for the Newport News Scottish Rite Valley for fifty years and was the Degree Captain for the 18<sup>th</sup> Degree for over thirty years.

Brother Sarfan will be greatly missed by all, and especially by all his Masonic Brethren.

## The Scottish Rite Can Help - THRIVE Virginia

THRIVE Peninsula, formerly DUCO (Denbigh United Church Outreach) is a 501 (c)(3) organization formed to aid the "poor" with financial counseling, some financial help, food, and bus tickets, etc. THRIVE is supported by approximately 60 churches plus some businesses and individuals.

## In 2016, THRIVE:

Assisted 194 families with Budget Education Distributed approximately 22.5 tons of food Distributed \$68,984 in bills overcome to prevent eviction or utility cutoff to essentially prevent homelessness.

Received some 3,700 volunteer hours
Only 32% of 2707 calls for help could be fulfilled in 2016

In early 2015, THRIVE contracted with a company that buys used shoes and then ships the shoes to countries where "shoelessness" is a common problem. Entrepreneurs are then given the materials to "set up shop". The positive results: (1) significantly fewer shoes to the **THRIVE** receives dump. (2) resources to help the poor, (3) entrepreneurs receive material to start a business. Recently, Scottish Rite contributed a 100 lb of shoes which batch aided THRIVE Peninsula's date collection of \$12,300 to aid the poor.
