Americanism Committee: Led by Bro. Brian Croteau, 32° KCCH, Committee Project Officer, School Coordinator, and primary presenter, and Illustrious Adrian "Pete" Eure, 33° IGH, Scottish Rite Valley of Newport News Secretary, certificate preparer and presenter, your Americanism Committee, recognized some six Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) College students and 22 Junior ROTC High School students this Spring at their annual awards ceremonies. Awards are also presented for the local Sojourners Chapter.

Annually, just after the first of the year, local Colleges and High-Schools contact the Project Officer with the names, cadet grades, and date of ceremony; the Project Officer then coordinates with the Scottish Rite Secretary who physically prepares the personalized Certificates and Medals for presentation. Medals and Certificates for Sojourner nominees are provided by the Sojourners.

Negotiations are underway to merge a Southside Chapter of the Sojourners with Langley-Monroe Chapter-# 310 - should the merger occur, in future years several more volunteers will be needed to visit schools both on the Peninsula and the Southside to make presentations.

On Saturday, May 28, 2016, members of the Scottish Rite and several "Blue Lodges" once again led by Ill. "Pete" Eure, 33° IGH, and Bro. Brian Croteau, 32° KCCH, placed miniature American Flags on Military Veterans Graves at the Peninsula Cemetery. Each Saturday morning before Memorial Day, a Newport News VFW organization provides flags and organizations - various groups e.g., Boy Scouts, Masons, etc. volunteer to place the flags. Most difficulty occurs the following Tuesday when the Flags need to be recovered and Boy Scouts etc. are not available. Come out next year - you will feel good about yourself.

Facilities Committee: The Facilities Committee, Led by Bro. Paul Lubic Jr., 32° KCCH, conducted a fund-raising-auction on Saturday, April 30th in the Scottish Rite Social Hall. Scottish Rite Brother "Wimpy" Isgett and his son (also a Mason), both professional auctioneers, donated both their time and expertise to the activity. The "Kitchen Crew" including Bro. Bill Overby, 32° KCCH, Brothers Dan Savage, Manny Lasorda, and Mrs. Darlene Wilson and others, contributed to our "bottom line" by selling hamburgers, chips, etc. Approximately seventeen Masons, their families, and others donated items to be auctioned off. Although "turnout" was slight (approximately 15 bidders including the Isgetts), they bought the donated items resulting in a \$1,536.00 net profit to the Valley. The high-light of the day was the robust sale of a beautiful hand-made accessories box designed, built, AND donated by Ill. George T. (Tom) Mainwaring, 33° IGH, .
